Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to advise my concern that this application not be granted for the following reasons-

- The Prevention of Crime Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance

I believe that it will cause a nuisance to the local residents. Last week there was a man (probably drunk?) outside the shop passed out on the pavement. The shop assistant did not call for medical assistance. This was left to a customer who happened to be in the shop at the time. The owner of the shop arrived before medical assistance and just walked straight past the person on the floor and continued to unload his van. Not very caring for the Public's safety

- Prevention of Public Nuisance

On the grass corner of Shelly road every morning there are many empty alcohol cans and vodka bottles – extending the licence will encourage more of this anti-social behaviour.

- The Prevention of Crime Disorder

I have also been unfortunate enough to witness full frontal a man urinating at this spot. He is frequently wondering the street with tins of polish beer in his hands it is a brand that is frequently sold at this shop.

- Prevention of Public Nuisance

The lights from the shop at night are too bright and will cause light pollution for people living next door or opposite. It is bright enough that I can see from inside my house with wooden blinds shut the lights go out at 10:30 when they close at present. I am not directly opposite!

- Public Safety

I am concerned that traffic will be stopping outside the shop at all times of day and night. The road has had several accidents at night and I think this will be increased by stationary traffic outside the shop. I'm concerned that there will be lots of HGV drivers stopping during the evening- it is residential and the noise of the vehicle's is bad enough just passing at night stopping and starting of HGV's to visit the shop will cause a greater degree of noise pollution when people are trying to sleep.

Please can you confirm to me that my concerns over the extended licencing have been received?
