Panels

Members of Environment and Non-executive Functions Scrutiny Committee do not serve on the Leisure Panel or the Community Cohesion Panel.

The Role of Scrutiny Committees

The role of scrutiny committees is as follows

- To hold the Executive to account
 - By considering Executive decisions which are 'called in'
 - By giving advice to the Executive about matters included in their forward plan
- To monitor and evaluate performance
 - Using performance Indicators
 - And best Value reviews of services
- To examine topics of public interest or concern
- To consider topics referred by the Executive
- To undertake policy development, reviews and revision
- To undertake the role of community champion
 - By reviewing the performance of other public and 'common' services
 - By considering matters affecting the area and/or local people

Work completed

The Committee has met generally every four weeks throughout the last municipal year. The topics considered by the Committee are set out in the attached appendix. Notable successes of the Committee include clear recommendations to the Executive to allow Hackney Carriages but not Private Hire Vehicles to use bus lanes, the recommendation to take the Translink project to the next stage involving a public enquiry, the lobbying of the Government and the Strategic Raul Authority for the earlier implementation of the Thameslink 2000 project to improve rail services and capacity and the identification of serious concerns about aspects of the design of the proposed Bedford Roads Bus Lanes scheme.

A number of topics remain under review including the Translink project which will be kept under review as it progresses to the next phase, the proposals for the completion of the inner ring road and the development of the town centre traffic management strategy as each phase is completed, the feasibility of a pilot community bus scheme and the development and implementation of bus priority measures.

Future Work

The Committee has considered an extensive range of topics over the last twelve months but only a few of them have been considered in any great depth or have given rise to significant recommendations to the Executive or to the Council. This has been a common experience of all four Committees. The Scrutiny Board, at their meeting in December 2001, considered the experience of operating scrutiny since its inception in May 2000. The outcome of their consideration was a decision to adopt a much more structured and planned approach to scrutiny involving in depth reviews of relatively few major topics. The advice that is being given to the Scrutiny Committees is to have regard to the Council's vision, its corporate plan and the main priorities for the forthcoming year in considering what topics to select for the new work programme. The Committee will be considering its work programme for the forthcoming municipal year and submitting proposals to the Scrutiny Board at their meeting on 15th May 2002.
