## **PURPOSE**

The premises will be protected by a comprehensive CCTV system (see plans for locations) full training will be provided to staff on the use of the system, in particular providing disclosure to the police. The premises will also be protected by a wired alarm system with a panic button.

### Public Safety

The premises will have all the required health and safety certificates issued by the relevant authorities. The DPS holds a valid SIA licence which means she has enhanced competencies in relation to handling difficult situations such as drunk/troublesome customers.

## The Prevention of Public Nuisance

All matters of nuisance or unsociable behaviour will be reported to the DPS immediately and if need be, to the police.

## The Protection of Children from Harm

Strict age checks will be adopted using the national challenge 25 policy. DPS will be on guard against anyone she suspects is buying alcohol for a minor.

Please find attached a very detailed set of guidance for the sale of alcohol and general compliance with the law which will be adopted as a formal business policy. The business policy outlines how the licensing objectives will be met.
