# The Role of Scrutiny Committees

The role of scrutiny committees is as follows

- To hold the Executive to account
  - By considering Executive decisions which are 'called in'
  - By giving advice to the Executive about matters included in their forward plan
- To monitor and evaluate performance
  - Using performance Indicators
  - And best Value reviews of services.
- To examine topics of public interest or concern
- To consider topics referred by the Executive
- To undertake policy development, reviews and revision
- To undertake the role of community champion
  - By reviewing the performance of other public and 'common' services
  - By considering matters affecting the area and/or local people

# Work completed

The Committee has met generally every four weeks throughout the last municipal year. The topics considered by the Committee are set out in the attached appendix. Notable successes of the Committee include completion of best value reviews on services for adults with learning difficulties and the music service, lobbying the Government through the MPs on the issue of Health Funding for Bedfordshire, drawing attention to and publicising the scale of schools' unspent balances, recommendations that the quality protects action plan should emphasise the benefits of and the funding needed for early intervention and focus on raising educational attainment of looked after children, recommendations about joining up educational and social services initiatives focussed on the same categories of children and recommendations for initiatives on teacher recruitment.

A number of topics remain under review including the monitoring of performance in key areas of educational attainment, attendance, behaviour and inclusion.

## **Future Work**

The Committee has considered an extensive range of topics over the last twelve months but few of them have been considered in any great depth or have given rise to significant recommendations to the Executive or to the Council. This has been a common experience of all four Committees. The Scrutiny Board, at their meeting in December 2001, considered the experience of operating scrutiny since its inception in May 2000. The outcome of their consideration was a decision to adopt a much more structured and planned approach to scrutiny involving in depth reviews of relatively few major topics. The advice which is being given to the Scrutiny Committees is to have regard to the Council's vision, its corporate plan and the main priorities for the forthcoming year in considering what topics to select for the new work programme. The Committee will be considering its work programme for the forthcoming municipal year and submitting proposals to the Scrutiny Board. "School admissions" has been identified as a priority topic for the future work programme.
