Prevention of Crime and Disorder	1-2 Off License that open into evening sometimes attract those who have already been drinking and crime and disorder can follow. Therefore CCTV is essential

Prevent public nuisance, crime and disorder:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1, The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Bedfordshire Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. CCTV recordings shall be retained throughout the subsequent 31 day period and copies supplied as soon as practicable and no later than 48 hours after the request of the Police or authorised officer. 2, A staff member from the premises who conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police Officers recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested. 3, All staff serving alcohol who are non Personal Licence holders must have written authority by the Designated Premises Supervisor to sell alcohol on their behalf. They must be trained with regard to their responsibilities in relation to licensing law. All written authority and records of training provided must be available for production to the Police or Licensing authority upon request. 4, All alcohol must be marked with the shop name.
