# Background Background

S

1. The provisional and estimated Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) for 2020-21 were discussed at previous meetings of the schools forum in the spring and summer terms. In July the Education Funding Agency published revised allocations for all Local Authorities, following the data-cleansing of the January 2020 Early Years Census and in addition published the retrospective 2019-20 adjustments being allocated to LA's. The purpose of this report is to update Schools Forum members of the revised allocations for Luton.

## Report

2. The schools block funding of £4,306.48 per pupil for primary pupils and £5,610.41 per pupil for secondary pupils based on the October 2019 census was confirmed and finalised in December 2019. The High Needs Block was also largely finalised in December 2019 but was updated in March 2020 when EFA revised the allocation to account for high needs places in respect of Alternative Provision, Free Schools and high needs places commissioned by other local authorities.



- 3. However, the Early Years block has only been finalised in July 2020, following the DfE's processing of the January 2020 pupil and early years counts.
- 4. The revised pupil numbers and DSG are shown in the table below, together with a comparison to the budgeted figures.

5. In addition, the retrospective adjustment to the 2019-20 DSG driven by the January 2019-20 early years census is an increase of £196k. The previously confirmed 2019-20 DSG cumulative underspend therefore increases by that amount to £2.810m. The £196k is the result of higher levels of 3&4 year olds (almost £300k) and fewer Part Time Equivalent two year olds (almost £100k) recorded on the census
