### **PURPOSE**

1. To bring before the committee an update on the issues that were raised following the last Area Committee held on the 18<sup>th</sup> January 2006.

### **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

2. The South Luton Area Committee are recommended to note the report and make recommendations on further action where required.

### **BACKGROUND**

3. This report encapsulates the progress of the area committee since the implementation of the initiative in October 2001. In addition it includes information on projects and activities supported by the committee and by liaison and mediation with both internal and external service areas, pursues the concerns raised by both the local community and Members of the council.

### REPORT

- 4. Members of the public who appear on the current database were informed of this meeting by post on the 28<sup>th</sup> February 2006 and publicity for this cycle of meetings appeared in the Luton News and Herald & Post during week commencing 6<sup>th</sup> March 2006 and in the Luton on Sunday on the 12<sup>th</sup> March 2006.
- 5. Additionally, posters in keeping with the new style advert and corporate approach to area committees were also dispatched to every General Practitioner, Dental Practice, Chiropodists, Chiropractors, Educational establishment, Library, Sports Centre, Community & Youth Centre, Day Centre, Places of Worship and Sheltered Housing provision, across the borough. The information gave dates for every Area Committee and was then followed up with specific information about the Area Committee, relevant to that area.

- The area tours for the 2005/2006 Municipal Year for the South Luton area have now been completed and new dates for 2006/2007 are currently being secured.
- 11. The Action Plans and issues that were raised during the course of past area tours can be viewed in the folder at the back of the hall.

# AREA COMMITTEE PROMOTION

- 12. At a recent seminar that the Area Committee Support Officer attended ideas were exchanged regarding the promotion of area committees and ways of encouraging local communities to attend. In many cases that very first step through the door was the most important. Equally once local communities felt they could engage in issues that affected them most and that there was real response and positive outcomes from the discussions in which they partook, this then encouraged them to attend and participate in meetings in the future.
- 13. One of the schemes used and an example given by one the Police representatives to encourage local people to attend their meetings was to enter everyone who attended and who were still present at the end of the meeting into a free draw for a portable colour television.
- 14. The Council continually look at ways of encouraging local people to engage in meetings, consultations and participate in events that affect their local community.
- 15. At the moment area committees -
  - Advertise extensively in the local newspapers and Lutonline.

- Write to everyone currently on our database i.e. approximately 2500 people.
- Use the Luton Borough Council website.
- Carry out a borough wide poster distribution and a
- Large poster campaign outside the Town Hall.
- 16. The cost of three adverts i.e. Luton News, Herald & Post and the Luton Sunday in just one-week amounts to £498.00. This is a figure from the most recent January 2006 cycle. This excludes anything else mentioned in paragraph 9 of this report.
- 17. The purchase of five portable televisions to implement the scheme has cost the area committee advertising budget £210.00
- 18. Where we would normally place three adverts in the local newspapers in this cycle we only placed one in each of the three local newspapers making an overall saving of £1,284.00. This is just another way of using the advertising budget, encouraging and engaging people in their area committee and at the same time making an overall budget saving.
- 19. Members will be aware that a cash prize of £250.00 was offered by Electoral Services for the first registration returned in the recent canvass and similarly other prizes to encourage young people to get involved in groups, have also been used by departments in the Council. Therefore the adoption of such a scheme would not be completely alien to this Authority.
- 20. The promotion has been advertised by means of a press release and also included in the postal circulation to those on our database
- 21. The scheme will be administered by simple distribution of cloakroom tickets to members of the public towards the end of the area committee meeting. The participant would have to be present at the meeting to collect the prize otherwise it would be immediately drawn again. The prize will be awarded on the evening.
- 22. At the Area Committee Board meeting held on the 1<sup>st</sup> February 2006, Members approved the implementation of the scheme and a further report will be made to those Members at their next meeting and following the conclusion of this cycle of meetings.
