# **PURPOSE**

1. To notify the committee of a statutory review of Parliamentary Polling Districts and associated Polling Places being undertaken.

# **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

  - (ii) Approve an additional meeting of Administration Committee to be held on 22<sup>nd</sup> November, 2007 to approve the Parliamentary

# Polling Districts and Associated Polling Places to come into force with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> December, 2007.

#### **BACKGROUND**

3. The Electoral Administration Act 2006 requires each council to complete a full review of all its Parliamentary Polling Places and Polling Districts before 1<sup>st</sup> January 2008 and then review them at least every 5 years thereafter.

#### REPORT

- 4. The current Parliamentary Polling Districts, which are also used for all other elections, have been mainly unchanged since 1970s. There was an exercise to bring them into line with the new wards boundaries in 2003 and a further exercise to amalgamate those that had the same polling places in 2004.
- 5. The review requires consultation with those political parties elected representatives and other interested parties.
- 6. Letters were sent to all local political parties, MPs and local councillors last week asking for their views.
- 7. It is not envisaged to make wholesale changes but instead to look at the issues of access and distant voters have to travel to reach their local polling station. An additional problem in Luton is caused by the topography of the town. In many cases polling stations are located at the top of hills.

# PROPOSAL/OPTION

8. The annually updated register will be published on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2007. It would be sensible to make any changes arising from this review on that date. Administration committee is not due to meet between September and January so an additional meeting is necessary.
