Application for Variation of Premises Licence Biscot Mill/ The Hungry Horse, 231 Biscot Road, Luton.

I am writing at behest of my parents Mr & Mrs Islam of 21 Kennington Road whose property neighbours the above applicant. My parents wish to object to the above application, under the council's criteria of **'Prevention of Public Nuisance'**.

The applicant wishes to extend its provision of music and alcohol from 11.00am to 6.00am the next day on both Friday and Saturday night (see highlighted text with enclosed). They feel that the extended hours are tantamount to it becoming a nightclub for 2 days of the week. It should be noted that the applicant is in a residential zone and not in the town centre or other commercial zone where nightclubs are usually situated. And so it should be inappropriate to have this here.

The applied extended hours also contradicts the Hungry Horse company ethos as a *'family friendly Pub and restaurant'* as stated on their website.

Please note that on the 2nd of June the Pub was playing dance music till 5.00am, my parents have informed me that this has been happening once every month, they have not complained before as they did not want to cause a fuss.

My parents have been living next to the pub since 1988 and have had no quarrels with the Hungry Horse proprietors to date yet they feel that this application would not suit the area and the noise pollution generated would be intolerable for them at their age (69 and 59 respectively)

I implore you and other members of the licensing board to visit the applicant address and see for yourself the surrounding area - which comprises, primarily of residential houses.

The Licensing Service has received applications for the Variation Premises Licence for the above premises. The nature of the application is as follows:

Live & Recorded Music, Anything of a similar description to Music and Dance, Provision of facilities for making music, Provision of facilities for dancing Monday to Wednesday 11.00 to 23.00 Thursday 11.00 to 24.00 Friday to Saturday 11.00 to 06.00 Sunday 11.00 to 24.00 Late Night Refreshment Thursday 23.00 to 24.00 Friday & Saturday 23.00 to 06.00 Sunday 23.00 to 24.00 Supply of alcohol on and off the premises Monday to Wednesday 11.00 to 23.00 Thursday 11.00 to 24.00 Friday & Saturday 11.00 to 06.00 Sunday 11.00 to 24.00

Application requests to remove "Archaic Public entertainment conditions" and CCTV/tapes images to be retained for a minimum of 14 days and requesting they are replaced with "On Friday & Saturday nights two door staff from 23.00 to 30 minutes after closing" & "CCTV to be retained for a minimum of 31 days"

In accordance with Luton Borough Council's Licensing Policy, residents and other interested bodies within a 100-metre radius of the premises are to be notified when an application for the grant or variation of a licence made under the Licensing Act 2003 is received.

Residents or interested parties have the right to express any concerns they might have concerning such applications if they are of the opinion that to grant a licence or vary a licence would not be in the interest of the following licensing objectives:

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Protection of Children from Harm

If you have any concerns in respect of the above, and wish to make a representation, please do so in writing, to the address shown above, all representations must be received by Licensing Service by the date shown below by the end of the working day.

For a representation to be valid, it must contain your name and address, details of the premises you are making a representation about, and details of the grounds for your representation.
