I am writing with further comment to my submission dated 17th June 2020 as I do not intend to participate in the on-line hearing on 16th July 2020.

In my original submission I briefly raised my concerns about the need for this shop to extend its opening hours, and I would like to clarify that this reflects in :-

- ① Health and Safety - Covid 19 is still with us and I believe potential custom would come from outside of the immediate neighbourhood.
- ② Noise and Environmental Pollution - My fear is that such visitors would come with takeaways, purchase alcohol from the shop and then consume immediately outside, probably in small gatherings, talking loudly. And most likely, used packaging and cans etc. would be discarded on the pavement or road, around the vicinity.

I have spoken with other residents of Bradley Road - who have not made representation to Luton Borough Council - but are also concerned about potential deterioration in our local area. By this, I refer especially to the increasing litter, which could have damaging environmental and health issues. With the Council looking at making budgetary reductions, I am sure that street clearing will be affected. My neighbours and myself regularly - and frustratingly - pick up litter, and we do not want to see this increase! I did speak to my local councillors, prior to the pandemic outbreak, expressing my concerns about the littering. At present, after 9pm onwards - when the shop is shut - local residents are in their homes. They do not have to go out for alcohol, and would presumably have purchased within existing business hours for consumption indoors. Therefore, I conclude that I consider any extended opening hours to be unnecessary and potentially harmful.

Regulation 8

- (1) A party shall give to the authority within the period of time provided for in the following provisions of this regulation a notice stating:
- (a) Whether he intends to attend or be represented at the hearing;
 - (b) Whether he considers a hearing to be unnecessary.

(2) In a case where a party wishes any other person (other than the person he intends to represent him at the hearing) to appear at the hearing, the notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall contain a request for permission for such other person to appear at the hearing accompanied by details of the name of that person and a brief description of the point or points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to the application, representations or notice of the party making the request.

(3) In the case of a hearing under:

- (a) Section 48(3)(a) (cancellation of interim authority notice following police objection), or
- (b) Section 105(2)(a) (counter notice following police objection to temporary event notice),

The party shall give the notice no later than one working day before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

(4) In the case of a hearing under:

- (a) Section 167(5)(a) (review of premises licence following closure order),
- (b) Paragraph 4(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing licence),
- (c) Paragraph 16(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing club certificate), or
- (d) Paragraph 26(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application by holder of justices' licence for grant of a personal licence),

The party shall give the notice no later than two working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

(5) In any other case, the party shall give the notice no later than five working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.
