### **PURPOSE**

 The purpose of this report is to enable the Licensing Panel to consider the application received from Mr Wesley Scott, 7 Weldon Close, Luton. LU2 9TS for the review of the Premises Licence in respect of Strides Café Bar and Club Blue Note, Wigmore Lane Luton. LU2 9XG

#### RECOMMENDATION

2. That the Licensing Panel determine the application of Mr Wesley Scott for the review of a Premises Licence in respect of Strides Café Bar and Club Blue Note, Wigmore Lane Luton. LU2 9XG.

### **BACKGROUND**

3. On 30<sup>th</sup> November 2005, the Licensing Panel determined an application for a Premises Licence in respect of the Blue Note Club, Well Space, Wigmore Lane, Luton. The Panel decided to grant the licence notwithstanding the representations received, subject to two additional conditions. The first condition limited the maximum number of persons to be admitted to enter the premises to 140 (with mixed seating/standing) or 200 (if standing only) and the second condition required signage to be installed asking customers to leave the premises quietly.

- 4. On 4<sup>th</sup> April 2007 the Licensing Panel considered an application by the licensee for a Variation of the Premises Licence. The variation sought was to change the name of the premises and to allow various structural alterations to take place to the premises. The application for variation did not seek a variation of the licensable activities or the trading hours. In determining the application, the Panel considered representations made by various persons. The Panel decided to grant the variation subject to the following conditions:-
  - (1) All doors and windows shall be kept closed during periods of regulated entertainment (save for access and egress).
  - (2) Noise from the premises shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive properties

and

(3) The Licensee should within 14 days provide an acoustic report to demonstrate that when regulated entertainment takes place noise emanating from the premises shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive properties as required by the foregoing condition and that if any works are required to achieve this then full details shall be submitted to the Council's Environmental Protection Team for written approval and shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Council's Environmental Protection Team within such time as shall be agreed. The current licence allows regulated entertainment, supply of alcohol, and late night refreshment, to take place. A copy of the licence, as amended is attached at Appendix A pages ( ).

### THE APPLICATION

- 5. An application for review of the premises licence was received on 11<sup>th</sup> April 2007 with regard to Strides Café Bar and Club Blue Note, Wigmore Lane, Luton. The applicant sates that they are a person living in the vicinity of the premises.
- 6. The application for review relates to the following licensing objectives:

Likely attraction of persons that will disruption and disturbance
