I am writing to register my objection to the application for variation of premises license by Biscot Mill, The hungry horse 231 Biscot Road, Luton.

The basis for this opposition is that granting a license for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives particularly the prevention of crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour.

The application proposes that alcohol will be sold off premises Monday to Wednesday 11:00 to 23:00.

The application will attract a lot of unnecessary wrong attention due to the nature of the business & intake of alcohol which will lead to violence and vandalism and nuisance in the whole area, which as a parent, I am genuinely concerned for the safety & protection of mine & other children in the area. Fights, vandalism & violence is harmful to children & adults around the area and such anti-social behaviour is totally unacceptable and tolerated under no circumstances. I would absolutely hate to think of the outrage of

would cause in the local community. If this goes ahead you will be liable for every incident that goes on.

The application requests live & recorded music 7 days a week. The amount of noise ^{pollution} will be unbearable for local residents, the whole community so it will be disruptive and disturbing bearing in mind in the residential homes where kids are concerned, it's a nuisance and disruptive for them. Also having a place like that in a friendly area will set a bad example to steer people in the wrong direction so it's a bad example and bad influence on kids.

In view of the above, I would urge the licensing authority to refuse the application.
