- Enabling young people to be responsible for equipment
- Staff who are friendly and approachable The evaluation (monthly/fortnightly) of all activities
- Staff who encourage and implement the ideas of young people
- Clear signposting of buildings, clubs and projects

- Young people to have fun as well as receive education (life skills)
